- 1. Whats Our Story? Tuesday 2/13, or Thursday 2/15, 6-8pm, The Bible is the story of God's love for us. It begins with Him creating us out of love, redeeming us by love and finally, transforming us in His love.
- 2. **Who is Jesus?** Tuesday 2/20, or Thursday 2/22, 6-8pm. Jesus is both God and man, and therefore, reveals who God is in relation to us. Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:15). He asks this same question of us: who do you say Jesus is?
- 3. **Am I Saved?** Tuesday 2/27, or Thursday 2/29, 6-8pm. Salvation is a gift from God through Jesus Christ that requires our "yes".
- 4. **Why a Church?** Tuesday 3/5, or Thursday 3/7, 6-8pm. Jesus didn't simply leave us a message or instruction manual to follow. He left us a living, dynamic Church where we can encounter Him constantly and be transformed into His likeness.

5. **God is with Us.** Tuesday 3/12, or Thursday, 3/14 6-8pm. God's presence in the Old Testament foreshadows the gifting of the Eucharist, on of the seven sacrements of the Church. Jesus establishes the Eucharist to give us strength for our journey, and to accompany us at every moment.

Hello, my name is Bernadette "Bernie" Hull. As parishioners of St. Olaf, you may have heard that my husband, Duane, passed away in a tragic accident in late 2022. To honor his memory, I have set up a scholarship in his name for a cause dear to our hearts—Catholic schools.

Duane and I greatly appreciated our experience in attending Catholic schools. Money was tight for our parents, so paying tuition for Catholic school was a challenge. Duane was able to get a job in high school to pay his tuition. My family was fortunate to receive scholarships to help pay for my siblings' and my tuition.

Based on our experience, we invested in tuition for our children to attend Catholic elementary through high school. We believe strongly that our children's experience in attending Catholic schools paved their way for success in college, careers and life. We are truly grateful.

To honor Duane's memory, I have established the Duane Hull Memorial Scholarship, which has been endowed to generate an annual \$1,000 scholarship. Each year, this scholarship will go to a St. Olaf parishioner who would like to attend Regis or McDonell Catholic schools.

If you are interested or know someone else who may be interested in receiving this scholarship, information to apply will be available in our parish office.





Lenten Regulations:

- Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, & Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
